To Protect Our Air?

PROBLEM: Texas is known for many great things: unique wildlife, uncommon history, beautiful bluebonnets, family, friends, food, and sports. There is one thing, however, that Texans do not want to boast about: air pollution. Unfortunately, many Texas cities are under threat from air pollution—specifically **ground level ozone** pollution. Not to be confused with the ozone layer found in the upper atmosphere, **ground level ozone** can harm the natural environment, vegetation, human and animal health. The Central Texas Air Information and Research (CTAIR) Program wants to keep the air in Texas clean for everyone, and we need your help!

Posters shall be titled "**Do Your Share for Cleaner Air.**" Please keep words on the poster to a minimum—illustrations show up best. Please submit original artwork only—no trademark images.

Posters can be no larger than 11x17 inches.

Winners will be chosen from each school category (Elementary, Middle, and High School). **The winning entries will be used in CTAIR's Education Outreach campaigns.** All entries become the property of CTAIR.
