Meeting Minutes:

- 1. Call to Order: Uryan Nelson called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.
- 2. Opportunity for Public Comment: No comments were made by the public.
- 3. Staff Update: 2045 MTP Reprioritization.

Uryan Nelson stated that a copy of the 2045 MTP Reprioritization Schedule is included in the meeting packet.

4. Discussion and Action Item: Regarding FY21-24 and FY25-31 Category 2, 7, and 9 funding allocations for the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) Reprioritization.

Kendra Coufal reviewed the actions on the reprioritization process to date. Ms. Coufal explained which funding scenarios were being presented today, highlighting changes made and new scenarios added since the June 2nd meeting. The floor opened for discussion.

Sam Listi stated that he has concerns about Belton's E 6th Avenue not being included in many of the scenarios or if included only being in the long-range portion for funding as that project is Belton's most important. Jason Deckman and Ryan Haverlah both suggested that phasing the project might help. Several members further discussed ideas for including the E 6th Ave project into the TIP portion of a scenario. The group had consensus on funding the Warriors Path and Old Nolanville Rd bridge projects and trying to include as many entities as possible in the TIP.

David Mitchell made a motion to recommend Scenario C2b with the change of replacing the Williams Rd project (S45-03) with the Royal Street project (S45-01) and decreasing the programmed amounts for Rancier Ave (K45-01) and Georgetown Rails to Trails Phase I (T40-13a) by 9.3% each, seconded by Ryan Haverlah; the motion passed with 1 nay.

5. Discussion and Action Item: Regarding recommendation to initiate public involvement for amendments to the FY21-24 TIP and 2045 MTP.

Uryan Nelson stated that the reprioritized MTP listing as well as new TIP language regarding performance measures needed to go out for public involvement prior to final approval by the Policy Board.

Ryan Haverlah made a motion to recommend the initiation of public involvement for amendments to the FY21-24 TIP and 2045 MTP, seconded by David Olson; the motion passed unanimously.

6. Member Comments:

Ryan Haverlah thanked staff for all the work they put in to create the funding scenarios.

7. Adjourn: The meeting adjourned at 11:34 a.m.
