Meeting Minutes:

- 1. Call to Order:** Uryan Nelson called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.
- 2. Opportunity for Public Comment:** No comments were made by the public.
- 3. Staff Update:** Meeting Schedule; Other Updates; Administrative Amendments; Air Quality.

Uryan Nelson informed the TAC of upcoming KTMPPO meetings through April and stated that the March meetings are tentatively planned to be in person at this time. Mr. Nelson reminded the TAC that staff are preparing for the Federal Certification Review (FCR) that KTMPPO will be undergoing in the spring. Mr.

Nelson notified the members of three administrative amendments to project let dates. Maximum ozone air quality readings for the month of January were 56 parts per billion (ppb) at the Temple station and 54 ppb at the Killeen station.

4. Action Item: Approve minutes from the January 5, 2022 meeting.

David Williams noticed a clerical error in the minutes date.

Bobby Lewis made a motion to approve the January 5, 2022 meeting minutes with the corrected date, seconded by Jason Deckman; the motion passed unanimously.

5. Discussion and Action Item: Regarding Resolution 2022-02 supporting Safety Performance Measure Targets (PM1) for the region.

Bob van Til and Jason Deckman expressed some concerns with approving “higher” safety targets that could appear to be condoning traffic injuries and fatalities in the transportation system. Mr. Deckman recommended to add a clause to the resolution stating that the MPO supports the ultimate statewide goal of zero traffic fatalities and Mr. van Til concurred.

David Williams made a motion to recommend approval of Resolution 2022-02 supporting Safety Performance Measure Targets (PM1) for the region with the clause recommendation, seconded by Bob van Til; the motion passed unanimously.

6. Discussion Item: Regarding review of Draft FY23-26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

James McGill informed the TAC that staff has begun development of the FY23-26 TIP and is planning to add projects for FY25-26. Mr. McGill shared a tentative development schedule and how much funding was estimated to be available for additional projects. The floor opened for discussion.

Multiple TAC members shared thoughts on project readiness and which projects they felt most deserving to be added to the TIP. Projects discussed included Belton’s E 6th Ave project, Killeen’s Chaparral Rd Phase 1, Copperas Cove’s SH 9 Offramp, and Temple’s Georgetown Railroad Trail Phase 2.

7. Discussion Item: Regarding Kimley Horn presentation on Dashboard Safety Tool.

Dan Malsom and Caroline Leonard with Kimley Horn presented the KMTPO Safety Tool Dashboard to the members and gave a brief training on how to navigate the dashboard.

8. Discussion Item: Regarding public input received through January 2022.


Public input received through January 2022 was presented to the TAC. No new comments were submitted since the last meeting.
