

    - New TXDOT STIP Dashboard
  - Rider 7 Air Quality Planning Program
    - The Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI) developed an Air Quality Sketch Planning Tool which will allow KTMPO to estimate the impact of a transportation project on air pollutant levels in the region.
    - CTCOG is receiving approximately \$380,000 for 2022-23 to conduct air pollutant monitoring activities.
  - The Reason Foundation recently released its annual report ranking the most costeffective highway systems by state. Texas ranks 16<sup>th</sup> moving up two spots from 18<sup>th</sup> last year. (Link)
  - KTMPO will be undergoing a Federal Certification Review (FCR) in the Spring, staff is beginning to prepare for this.

# **Major IIJA Components** (all dollar figures are five-year totals)

\*

- \$1.2 trillion for transportation, broadband, electricity grid, water infrastructure.
- \$351 billion for highway programs.
  - Of which \$307 billion is in formula funding to states.
  - \$26.9 billion for Texas
- Creates a new \$27.5 billion formula-based program for bridges.
  - Eligible uses include highway bridge replacement, rehabilitation, preservation, protection, or construction projects on public roads.
  - \$537.2 million for Texas
- Includes \$91 billion for public transit (49% increase over the FAST Act).
  - Funds are for local buses, subways, commuter rail, light rail, paratransit, and ferries.
  - \$450 million to TxDOT for rural transit.
- A new National Electric Vehicle Formula Program receives \$7.5 billion.
  - Requires the Department of Transportation and the Department of Energy to jointly develop guidance for states and localities to strategically deploy EV charging infrastructure.
  - \$407.8 million for Texas

### **Meeting Minutes**

- 1. Call to Order: Mayor Spencer Smith called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.
- 2. Opportunity for Public Comment: No comments were made by the public.
- 3. Staff Update: Meeting Schedule; FM 2271 Public Hearing; Federal and State Updates; Air Quality.

Uryan Nelson informed the Board of upcoming KTMPO meetings through December. Mr. Nelson shared that TxDOT held a public meeting on November 15<sup>th</sup> for the FM 2271 Feasibility Study and the virtual presentation were available online for public comment. Mr. Nelson provided updates on federal highway funding extensions, the passage of the infrastructure bill, DOT's Climate Action Plan, and FHWA/USDOT's Curbside Inventory Report. Maximum ozone air quality readings for the month of October were 75 parts per billion (ppb) at the Temple station and 77 ppb at the Killeen station.

**4. Action Item:** Approve minutes from the October 20, 2021 meeting.

Mayor Jose Segarra made a motion to approve the October 20, 2021 meeting minutes, seconded by Ryan Haverlah; the motion passed unanimously.

**5. Discussion and Action Item:** Regarding recommended allocation for additional Category 7 funds made available through the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA).

Uryan Nelson informed the group that additional Category 7 funds through CRRSAA are available for use by MPOs now, KTMPO allocated amount is \$2.162 million. James McGill explained the two funding scenarios that staff is proposing for the additional Category 7 dollars. No questions were asked by the Board.

David Williams made a motion to approve Funding Scenario D2, seconded by Sam Listi; the motion passed unanimously.

6. Discussion Item: Regarding Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Call – FY23-25.

This item was tabled and postponed to the December meeting due to the presenter being unable to make the meeting.

7. Discussion Item: Regarding the Bell County Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP).

Judge Roger Miller gave a presentation on the background and development of the HCP along with potential impacts to KTMPO. Members asked a few questions regarding the timeline of the Habitat Conservation Plan.

**8. Discussion Item:** Public input received through October 2021.

Public input received through October 2021 was presented to the Board. No new comments were received since the last meeting.

### 9. Member Comments:

Jason Deckman provided an update on Temple's Mobility Master Plan and shared that a second public meeting will be held on January 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Uryan Nelson introduced Dominic Elizondo, a new planner with KTMPO to the Board.

### Amendments to the FY21-24 TIP and 2045 MTP

### MTP Background

The Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is the 25-year long range planning document for KTMPO. The 2045 MTP includes a short and long-range prioritized project listing incorporating projects expected to be funded within the document's 25-year planning horizon. The project listing is fiscally constrained based on the projected funding the MPO expects to receive in the 25 year planning period. The document also lists regionally significant unfunded projects. Projects must be included in the funded section of the MTP in order to receive state or federal funding.

### **TIP Background**

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a 4-year transportation planning document that includes a detailed listing of projects reasonably expected to begin within a four-year period. The current TIP covers FY21 through FY24. Projects included in the TIP must be consistent with the MTP and are chosen based on regional priority and available funding. An amendment to a TIP is not completed until the change has also been included in the STIP—Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.

### Amendments to the 2045 MTP and FY21-24 TIP

Amendments are needed to the MTP and TIP to:

- a) Add newly selected MPO projects to the TIP; and
  - i. S45-03 Williams Rd Sidewalks;
  - ii. A45-02 HCTD Bus Replacement; and
  - iii. R45-01 Bartlett Elementary SRTS.
- b) Revise the project cost for the following projects.
  - i. T40-13a Georgetown Railroad Trail Phase 1; and
  - ii. H30-03b Warriors Path Phase 2.




#### TxDOT Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Update

The Texas Transportation Commission on May 30, 2019 adopted the "Road to Zero" mission. The overall goal is to reduce fatalities by half in 2035 and eliminate fatalities on Texas roads by 2050. A major component of the "Road to Zero" mission is the Texas Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) which details specific actions to be taken that will make Texas roads safer. Click here to view the 2017-2022 SHSP.

Last month, the Waco District held a project call for their Category 8 - Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP). Approximately \$2.3 million in Category 8 Safety funds are available for these projects. Program funds are eligible to cover 90% of project construction cost, with the other 10% covered by local participation.

TxDOT will provide a brief update on the Highway Safety Improvement Program.

## **Purpose of HSIP**



- "The Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) is a core Federal-aid program with the purpose to achieve a significant reduction in traffic fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads, including non-State-owned roads. The HSIP requires a datadriven, strategic approach to improving highway safety on all public roads with a focus on performance."
- Federally-funded, State-administered
- Establish annual safety performance targets for five measures
- If a State doesn't meet performance targets additional annual reporting requirements

Legislated under Section 148 of Title 23, United States Code (23.U.S.C 148) and regulated under Part 924 of Title 23, Code of Federal Regulation (23 CFR Part 924)

## **HSIP Project Selection**



- Consider the following when selecting HSIP projects:
  - Is the strategy, activity, or project consistent with the priorities of Texas' SHSP?
  - Does the project address a serious crash risk such as a hot spot, systemic risk factor, road segment, or crash type that has been identified through a data driven process?
  - Is the project likely to contribute to a significant reduction in fatalities and serious injuries?
  - Is this project consistent with the District Safety Plan?

- Distracted Driving
- Impaired Driving
- Intersection Safety
- Older Road Users
- Pedestrian Safety
- Roadway and Lane Departures
- Speeding

## **Program Funding**



- Program funds are eligible to cove 90% of project construction costs.
- Local participation must cover the remaining 10% of project construction cost.
- Excluded cost not covered by HSIP funds include:
  - Design/engineering cost
  - Environmental permits
  - Right of Way (ROW)
  - Additional contingencies
  - Additional work not covered by the scope of approved safety countermeasures




## Increased Federal Share (G-Match)

- Many countermeasures (work codes) have been designated as eligible to be considered for increased federal share (100% federal funds) for off-system projects.
- A project is not guaranteed the increased share until TxDOT's Traffic Division and Finance Division has reviewed and approved the project.


