

Meeting Minutes

- 1. Call to Order: Mayor Spencer Smith called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.
- **2. Opportunity for Public Comment:** Jason Deckman provided an update on Temple's Mobility Master Plan and shared that a second public meeting will be held on January 19, 2022 in the evening.
- 3. Staff Update: Meeting Schedule; Other Updates; Air Quality.

Uryan Nelson informed the Board of upcoming KTMPO meetings through April and stated that after discussing with the Chair, the February meetings are now scheduled to be electronic. Mr. Nelson informed the board on the FHWA Bipartisan Infrastructure bill and how to access that information. Mr. Nelson also informed the board that staff is preparing for KTMPO's required four-year Federal Certification Review (FCR) in the spring and will continue to update the group on the process. Maximum ozone air quality readings for the month of December were 40 parts per billion (ppb) at the Temple station and 45 ppb at the Killeen station.

4. Action Item: Approve minutes from the December 15, 2021 meeting.

Mayor Jose Segarra made a motion to approve the December 15, 2021 meeting minutes, seconded by Councilmember Debbie Nash-King; the motion passed unanimously.

5. Discussion and Action Item: Regarding approval of amendments to the FY21-24 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP).

Uryan Nelson listed the proposed amendments to the TIP and MTP. Mr. Nelson informed the Board that all public involvement for these amendments has been completed and no comments were received from the public.

Mayor Tim Davis made a motion to approve amendments to the FY21-24 TIP and 2045 MTP, seconded by David Williams; the motion passed unanimously.

6. Discussion Item: Regarding the development of the FY23-26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

James McGill informed the Board that staff has started to prepare the draft FY23-26 TIP. Mr. McGill shared a tentative schedule for the TIP development and stated that the completed TIP was due to TxDOT by June 10, 2022.

7. Discussion Item: Regarding the public input received through December 2021.

Public input received through December 2021 was presented to the Board. No new comments were received since the last meeting.

8. Member Comments:

Darrell Burtner introduced Steve Beck with Henderson Transportation Group as the interim General Manager for HCTD.

Keith Sledd asked if the formal designation of the IH-14 route will have any impact on KTMPO TIP or MTP project rankings. Uryan Nelson said that he did not think so but would look into the matter and get back to Mr. Sledd.

Safety Performance Targets

The Safety Performance Rule (PM1), found in 23 CFR 490.207(a1-5), establishes safety performance measures to address fatalities and serious injuries on roadways and is evaluated using Fatality Analysis Reporting System (FARS) and Vehicular Miles Traveled (VMT) estimates. This Rule is to better invest transportation funding for safety improvement projects in order to support safe roadway networks.

TxDOT sets safety performance targets for five federally required safety performance measures. The five required performance measures are:

- number of fatalities,
- fatalities per million miles traveled,
- number of serious injuries,
- serious injuries per million vehicle miles traveled, and
- number of non-motorized fatalities and non-motorized serious injuries.

In January 2018, January 2019, February 2020, and March 2021 KTMPO Policy Board approved to support the State's safety performance targets.

In preparation for the annual target setting requirements, KTMPO has begun coordination efforts with TxDOT. Established targets from the State's Highway Safety Improvement Plan (HSIP) are included in the meeting packet for review. Similar to previous years, data for our region is limited and the reliability is questionable. KTMPO recommends continuing to support the State's performance targets until sufficient data becomes available.

Resolution 2022-02, supporting the adoption of the State's safety targets for the region is included in the meeting packet for review.

- February 2, 2022 TAC recommends approval of Resolution 2022-02 supporting the State's safety performance targets for the region.
- February 16, 2022 TPPB approves Resolution 2022-02 supporting the State's safety performance targets for the region.

A RESOLUTION OF THE KILLEEN-TEMPLE METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION ANNUAL ADOPTION OF TARGETS FOR SAFETY PERFORMANCE MEASURES ESTABLISHED BY THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

WHEREAS; The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has adopted the "Road to Zero" goal to cut traffic fatalities on Texas roadways to zero by the year 2050, and the Killeen-

Temple Metropolitan Planning Organization supports this ultimate goal; and

WHEREAS; The Texas Department of Transportation has established targets for the following 5 Performance Measures based on five year rolling averages:

- 1. Number of Traffic Fatalities; 3,563
- 2. Number of Serious Injuries; 16,677
- 3. Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT); 1.27
- 4. Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT; 5.76
- 5. Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-Motorized Serious Injuries, 2,367; and

WHEREAS; TxDOT approved the 2017-2022 Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) in July 2017 and

the 2022 Highway Safety Plan (HSP) on May 27, 2021; and

WHEREAS; the 2017-2022 SHSP describes the method of setting safety targets for Texas, and the

2022 HSP utilizes those methods to establish safety targets for the 5 federal

Performance Measures mentioned above for calendar year 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Killeen-Temple Metropolitan Planning Organization

Transportation Planning Policy Board has agreed to adopt and support the Texas Department of Transportation targets for the five safety performance measures

attached herein for 2022; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Killeen-Temple Metropolitan Planning Organization Transportation

Planning Policy Board will plan and program projects that contribute to the

accomplishment of said targets.

FY2022 STRATEGIC HIGHWAY SAFETY PLAN (SHSP) PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Performance Measures and Target Setting - TxDOT used a linear trend analysis to establish target(s), and analyzed the linear trend analysis of different data sets including three to five years of raw data as well as the moving averages for those data sets. While utilizing the linear trend analysis projections, the slope is determined to be a positive factor or negative factor.

The SHSP uses a data-driven, multi-year collaborative process to establish safety targets. The consensus of the SHSP stakeholder and executive teams is to utilize a methodology of establishing targets that would result in a 2% reduction from the original trend line projection in 2022. The proposed reduction of 2% by 2022, which only applies to positive slope projection trends, would be achieved by reducing each intermediate year by the following reduction percentages:

Year	Reduction
2017	0.0%
2018	0.4%
2019	0.8%
2020	1.2%
2021	1.6%
2022	2.0%

When the slope analysis projects a negative slope, the target set will mirror the projection determined by the slope.

Development of the FY 23-26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a 4-year transportation planning document that includes a detailed listing of projects reasonably expected to be let within a four-year period. The TIP is to be updated every two years with the last update occurring in 2020. The current TIP covers FY21 through FY24.

Projects included in the TIP must be consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and are chosen based on regional priority and available funding. The TxDOT Waco District and KTMPO have begun coordinating to complete a draft FY23-26 TIP using the latest 2022 Unified Transportation Plan (UTP) forecasts for Category Distribution.

Note: Included in your packet is a spreadsheet with two proposed alternatives for projects that could be added to the TIP in FY25 and FY26. The blue projects are from the roadway track and the green projects are from the livability track. The red project at the bottom of each scenario is a potential alternative for the last livability project listed. These alternatives are not presented as staff recommendations, just some ideas for what projects could be added to the TIP.

The final FY23-26 TIP must be submitted to TxDOT by June 10, 2022. A timeline for the STIP is included in your packet for review and the proposed schedule for the KTMPO TIP is provided below.
