

Meeting Minutes:

1. Call to Order: Judge Roger Miller called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m.

2. Opportunity for Public Comment: No comments were made by the public.

3. Staff Update: Meeting Schedule; Other Updates; Air Quality.

Uryan Nelson informed the Policy Board of upcoming KTMPO meetings through September. Mr. Nelson mentioned that the Bell County Thoroughfare Plan was approved on July 17. Mr. Nelson informed the Policy Board about the TxVEMP Grant funds for electric vehicle replacement. Mr. Nelson shared that NCTCOG and Transpod will be giving a presentation at the August 16th Policy Board meeting on a potential high-speed rail development along the I-35 corridor. Mr. Nelson shared information about attending the TEMPO meeting. Mr. Nelson stated he had conversations with TxDOT at this meeting to possibly utilize the fifty thousand dollars given to MPOs for safety planning as a match for the SS4A grant awarded to the CTCOG and Coryell County. Maximum ozone air quality readings for the month of June were 67 parts per billion (ppb) at the Temple station and 60 ppb at the Killeen station.

Councilmember Susan Long asked about the company Transpod coming to present. Uryan Nelson explained the initiative behind them coming to the August meeting to present, and that this is a private initiative from the company Transpod.

4. Action Item: Approve minutes from the June 21, 2023, meeting.

Mayor Michael Blomquist made a motion to approve the June 21, 2023, meeting minutes, seconded by Ryan Haverlah the motion passed unanimously.

5. Discussion Item: Regarding the 2050 MTP Update Timeline.

James McGill presented the 2050 MTP Timeline. Mr. McGill presented the draft application sheet for review and comments. Mr. McGill shared that a final application sheet will be sent out before the call for projects opens.

6. Discussion and Action Item: Regarding recommending approval of amendments to the FY23-26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) for projects:

- a) B45-03 13th Ave Sidewalk Improvements (Funding Reallocation)
- b) D45-01 W Main St/Luther Curtis Rd (Funding Reallocation & Let Date Change)
- c) K30-13a Chaparral Road Phase 1 (Let Date Change)
- d) S45-01 Royal Street Improvements (Project Cost Increase & Let Date Change)
- e) T40-13a Georgetown Railroad Phase 1 (Funding Category Change)
- f) W35-01 Copperas Cove Bypass (Project Cost Increase)
- g) W35-07 Loop 363 Overpasses (Add Project to TIP)
- h) A45-03 HCTD Micro Transit Technology (Add Project to TIP)

James McGill presented the proposed amendments which included changes to six projects and adding two projects to the TIP. Mr. McGill shared that no public comments were received during the public comment period. Mr. McGill informed the Board that project D45-01 is currently on track to let in August and after discussions with TxDOT staff are recommending that the project not be amended so the letting schedule is not interfered with.

Mayor David Leigh made a motion to approve all amendments except for D45-01 to the FY23-26 TIP and 2045 MTP, seconded by Ryan Haverlah; the motion passed unanimously.

7. Discussion and Action Item: Regarding Draft FY24-25 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP).

Uryan Nelson provided a brief overview of the UPWP. Mr. Nelson mentioned that the funding plan in the document is a budget estimate, since KTMPO has not been given the final funding amount from TxDOT. Mr. Nelson noted that the staff considered the impact of a new MPO and two new TMAs while drafting the FY24-25 budget. James McGill provided an overview of the changes between the version sent out to members before the meeting and the latest version finalized the day before.

Riakos Adams made a motion to approve the Draft FY24-25 Unified Planning Work Program, seconded by Councilmember Susan Long; the motion passed unanimously.

8. Discussion Item: Regarding updates on the Bylaws, Safety, and Project Scoring Workgroups.

Uryan Nelson updated the Policy Board on the status of the working groups. Mr. Nelson mentioned that the Bylaws and Project Scoring Workgroups meet following the Policy Board meeting on June 21, 2023. Mr. Nelson provided information about the Bylaws discussion and that recommendations will be provided at an upcoming TAC meeting. James McGill provided information about the Project Scoring discussion and that recommendations will be provided at the August Meeting. Mr. McGill mentioned that staff is planning to have the first Safety Working Group meeting after the August TAC meeting.

9. Discussion Item: Regarding an update on the Safe Streets & Roads For All (SS4A) Grant.

Uryan Nelson provided an update on the current standing of the SS4A Grant. Mr. Nelson mentioned that the RFP period closed on Monday and that 3 proposals were received. Mr. Nelson shared that staff would review and score the proposals and then share that information with the KTMPO Chair and members of the CTCOG Executive Committee who will select a consultant. Mr. Nelson mentioned that as of this morning we have a signed grant agreement with FHWA.

Mayor Michael Blomquist asked what the current match was set as. Mr. Nelson stated that the match is eighty percent federal and twenty percent state match. Mayor David Leigh asked if there were guidelines on how this should be presented and shared at council meetings for the time to count as in-kind match for the grant. Judge Roger Miller highlighted that all the consultant proposals came back under budget. Uryan Nelson provided more information on this reasoning.

10. Discussion Item: Regarding an update on the possible MPO Boundary Expansion.

Uryan Nelson shared that there is currently no update on the possible MPO Boundary Expansion.

11. Discussion Item: Regarding public input received through July 2023.

James McGill informed the Policy Board of the two comments KTMPO has received, one in person comment about narrow bike lanes on 57th Street in Temple and one comment in response to some confusion with a public meeting TxDOT Brownwood District was holding.

12. Member Comments:

Mayor David Leigh asked about traffic concerns on I35. Victor Goebel stated that a consultant is on board currently to help improve intersections and add a lane in each direction.

13. Adjourn: The meeting adjourned at 10:19 a.m.

KTMPO Call for Projects Application Form and Project Scoring Guidelines Revisions

Background:

To prepare for the Fall Call for Projects KTMPO hosted a Project Scoring Workgroup, to revise the Project Scoring Guidelines. This working group consisted of members from both the TAC and TPPB. The Project Application Form and Project Scoring Guidelines was last updated in 2020.

Summary of Point Changes:

- Roadway Track
 - Remove criteria 7D Local Support.
 - Combine 4 criteria (8E Multimodal Support, 8G Transportation Enhancements & Livability, 8H – Sustainability, and 8I – Complete Streets), into 1 new criteria (8E - Multimodal Support, Livability, & Sustainability).
 - Overall reduction of 4 subjective criteria.
- Livability Track
 - Change the point scale for Criteria 1B Eliminates Barriers from 0-15 points to 0-5 points.
 - Combine Criteria 2A Provides Access to Jobs in EJCOC and 2B Provides Access to Jobs in Region into one new Criteria 2 – Provides Access to Jobs with 0-5 points possible instead of 0-10 points possible.
 - Remove Criteria 6F Security and Reliability
 - Remove Criteria 7D Local Support
 - Combine 3 criteria (6E Multimodal Support, 6G Transportation Enhancements & Livability, and 6H – Sustainability), into 1 new criteria (6E – Multimodal Support, Livability, & Sustainability).
 - Overall reduction of 4 subjective criteria.

2023 KTMPO Call for Projects Dates

Background:

The Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is the 25-year long range planning document for KTMPO. The MTP acts as a guide for the development, management, and operation of the region's multimodal transportation system. The MTP includes goals and strategies for addressing transportation needs in the region and provides a list of transportation projects expected to be constructed during the 25-year planning horizon.

An Updated MTP Update timeline is included in the packet for review. The timeline is subject to change as we move through the process. Staff will continue to provide updates and inform the TAC of changes.

KTMPO is planning on having a call for projects as part of the 2050 MTP Development. Staff are proposing these dates for the call for projects application period.

- Open Call for Projects on September 1, 2023
- Submission Deadline on October 27, 2023

Action Needed: Consider approval of the 2023 KTMPO Call for Project Dates.

• TAC approved the recommendation with the change to push the submission deadline back to October 27, 2023.

Grant Opportunities

• Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) Program

Deadline: August 18, 2023

Description: The vision of the PROTECT Discretionary Grant Program is to fund projects that address the climate crisis by improving the resilience of the surface transportation system, including highways, public transportation, ports, and intercity passenger rail. Projects selected under this program should be grounded in the best available scientific understanding of climate change risks, impacts, and vulnerabilities. They should support the continued operation or rapid recovery of crucial local, regional, or national surface transportation facilities. Furthermore, selected projects should utilize innovative and collaborative approaches to risk reduction, including the use of natural infrastructure, which is explicitly eligible under the program. Also called nature-based solutions, these strategies include conservation, restoration, or construction of riparian and streambed treatments, marshes, wetlands, native vegetation, stormwater bioswales, breakwaters, reefs, dunes, and shade trees. They reduce flood risks, erosion, wave damage, and heat impacts while also creating habitat, filtering pollutants, and providing recreational benefits. Projects in the PROTECT Discretionary Grant Program have the potential to demonstrate innovation and best practices that State and local governments in other parts of the country can consider replicating.

 Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant Program (MPDG) Deadline: August 21, 2023

<u>Description</u>: Three funding opportunities: the National Infrastructure Project Assistance grants program (Mega), the Nationally Significant Multimodal Freight and Highways Projects grants program (INFRA), and the Rural Surface Transportation Grant program (Rural). • Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods Grant Program (RCN) Deadline: September 28, 2023

<u>Description</u>: The Department of Transportation is combining two major discretionary grant programs, the Reconnecting Communities Pilot (RCP) and Neighborhood Access and Equity (NAE) programs, into one Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO). Together, this combined program is known as the Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods (RCN) Program. The primary goal of the NAE Program is to assist economically disadvantaged or undeserved communities for planning and construction activities. Funds for the fiscal year (FY) 2023 NAE grant program are to be awarded on a competitive basis to support planning, capital construction, and regional partnership activities that aim to restore community connectivity through the removal, retrofit, mitigation or replacement of highways, roadways, or other infrastructure facilities that create barriers to mobility, access or economic development.

The RCN NOFO solicits grant applications for the Reconnecting Communities Pilot discretionary grant program, established by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), and for the newly created Neighborhood Access and Equity discretionary grant program, established by the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA).




